Silkscreen print on glass, four layers of 40 x 40 x 2.5 cm each


The multi-part eye-tracking work deals with the representation of individual visual patterns of perception and raises the question of whether different personalities and perspectives also influence each other on a visual level.

For one of the two four-part Blanks series (shown here), four people each looked at a white square sheet, their field of vision being restricted to a 40 x 40 cm field. Each person was presented with the recordings of their eye movements while looking at the blank sheet again, recording the movements of their eyes again until four one minute sessions were reached.


